The Art & Importance of Listening: Shhh...Mmmm...Ahhh...

As an adjunct professor whose Introductory Psychology class is comprised largely of freshmen, I often

get approached by students for guidance on how to select a major. For students with a defined career goal in mind, this is a relatively simple task, but others struggle, as their visions of the future are far less clear. And then there are those, like my 18-year-old self, who feel certain what they want...but ultimately come to find it wasn't quite what they expected. 

Hillel and Shammai

Rabbi's Reflections

Rabbi Ilana Schwartzman



We already know how this decision will turn out, but the *why* is also important. As the Talmud tends to do, it does not give the two sages' reasoning from their own perspective. Instead, later rabbis explain why they took the stance they did.

Ulla said: Two Amoraim in the West (the Land of Israel) disagreed [on how to explain this disagreement between Bet Hillel and Bet Shammai, namely] R. Yossi bar Abin and R. Yossi bar Zevida. One said: The reason for Bet Shammai was according to the number of days left and the reason for Bet Hillel was according to the number of days that have passed. And one said: The reason for Bet Shammai was according to the number of bulls offered up on Sukkot, and the reason for Bet Hillel was that we increase in holiness and we don't decrease.

(Talmud Bavli, Shabbat 21b)

In this passage, there is one man Ulla presenting the interpretations of R. Yossi bar Abin and R. Yossi bar Zevida—they, in turn, are explaining the rulings of Hillel and Shammai. All of the explanations seem reasonable enough. On the Shammai side, we would reduce the candles either because we are counting down the days of Hanukah or to reflect Sukkot sacrifices (incidentally, there is a convincing argument that Chanukah is largely based on Sukkot). On the Hillel side, we would light more candles either because we are counting up the days or because we want to increase holiness. The practice that prevails is by and large attributed to this wish to increase holiness.

Perhaps this explanation is a little esoteric, a bit of intellectual trivia—but I prefer to think of it as an object lesson in how our ancestors hoped we would live our lives. First, it was given that we would be lighting the Chanukah candles. Second, they wanted us to pay attention to the how and the why of our rituals. Third, they wanted us to live in a way that would


expand holiness.

We might logically assume that as the days of the holiday decrease and as the oil in our Chanukah story decreased, we should also decrease our candles. Instead our sages teach us the opposite—bring more light, bring more holiness. Even when it is counter-intuitive, it's always worthwhile to have more light and more holiness in the world.

This is not just about Chanukah. Recently I was getting a haircut, and when my stylist learned that I am a rabbi, she asked specifically about my position on gay marriage. She comes from a faith tradition that frowns on this union, but my response to her is one informed by the idea of increasing holiness. We should be doing all we can to bring more light, more love, and more holiness into our lives and the lives of others.

May this season be one of light and holiness for us all.

Is your child having a bar or bat mitzvah? Form and photograph should be received by the synagogue by the 1st of the month as follows:

For a January or February date, by December 1
For a March or April date, by February 1
For a May or June date, by April 1
Thank you for your cooperation.

CHANUKAH MENORAH LIGHTING HINTS:

The first day of Chanukah is on **December 3**; therefore the first candle is lit the evening before (**December 2.**) Candles are placed in the *chanukiah* (Chanukah menorah) from right to left (the first night, place one candle all the way to the right, then add on from there each succeeding night.) Light candles from left to right (light the newest candle first, after you have lit the *shamash*, or service candle.)

First Blessing:

Second Blessing:

Blessed are you, Adonai our God, Ruler of the universe, who performed wondrous deeds for our ancestors, in those days at this time of year.

Third Blessing (recited first night only)






